### Journey Toward Wholeness (JTW) What Can I Do?

#### How the Federal Income Tax System Can Worsen Racial Disparities

Despite tax laws created to reduce racial disparities, the racial wealth gap in the U.S. has been widening since the 1980s. According to the Tax Policy Center, "White families hold nearly every type of asset (such as retirement accounts and businesses) at higher rates than families of color." The U.S. Department of the Treasury estimates that "92 percent of the tax value of the preferential treatment of long-term capital gains went to White families in 2023." ## What's Happening?

### Holy Week at First UU

The week before Easter is a holy time in the Christian calendar. On Friday, March 29 Tony Bianca and Rev. Justine will lead a "Good Friday" service in the chapel at 7 pm. This is a contemplative service, with readings and songs of lamentation that allow space for us to sit with feelings of loss and sorrow as we prepare to celebrate rebirth on Easter. On Saturday, March 30, Rev. Kristen and some members of the congregation will participate in a walk for Gaza, (See Rev. Kristen's article for more details). On Easter Sunday, March 31, we will have services at both campuses, including the Wheel of Life ritual, reading the names of those who have died over the last two years. Please note the Flower communion will be held in April, not on Easter Sunday.

### Gaza Ceasefire Pilgrimage San Diego

Saturday, March 30

(opportunities to participate throughout the day)

During this season of lent, people of faith in over 145 cities in 18 countries are engaging in a Gaza Ceasefire Pilgrimage in their cities. The intention is to embody prayerful solidarity with those who are suffering in Gaza, the West Bank, and Israel. During the pilgrimage, participants will be praying for:

1. Enduring and Sustained Ceasefire.
2. Immediate flow of life-saving food, water, aid, fuel and humanitarian assistance.
3. Release of all hostages – both the Israeli hostages held by Hamas – and the Palestinian hostages held in the Israeli prison system.
4. End of occupation so a just-peace can begin.

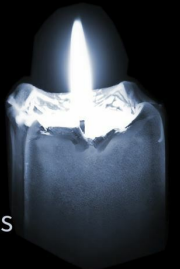
