**Climate Action: Support Clean Hydrogen Projects** 

Tell the Biden Administration not to give tax credits for hydrogen produced using fossil fuels. Hydrogen is most often produced from methane gas. Subsidies for dirty hydrogen projects lock in more fossil fuel production and increase climate and health-harming pollution. California AB 1550 would require that all hydrogen produced and/or used in California for the generation of electricity or fueling of vehicles be produced from renewable sources no later than 2045. <u>Make sure tax dollars go to hydrogen projects that are truly clean - Earthjustice</u>.


